UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- Buildings Ground
 - O Chief Kirko reported that LangCo NW have come out to ST25 to survey the bay floor. They will be providing a couple of quotes for different options on repairing/replacing the floor. 1) Replace the entire floor of the bay at ST25. 2) Replace just the bay floor that's sinking and add a drain system. We will need to obtain quotes from 3 different contractors.

- Whidbey Health Contract
 - o Chairman Koorn announced this will be discussed in Executive Session
- Training Officer Position / Deputy Chief Position
 - o Chief Kirko added Fire Officer 2 to the list of qualifications.

 - o The Commissioners do not have any questions regarding the budget.

 - o The Commissioners have agreed they would like to schedule an interview with the latest applicant, the 27th or 28th would work best.
- Brad Parks EF Recovery and charges
 - o Chief Kirko informed The Board that he met with Mr. Parks and they agreed to send a letter to USAA explaining the charges and that the taxes do not cover motor vehicle accidents. We are still waiting for a response from USAA regarding the coverage of the claim.
- 3 Sisters / ST28 Sale
 - o Chief Kirko informed the Board that we have not yet had a response from 3 Sisters. Chairman Koorn stated that he will get in contact with them.

NEW BUSINESS

- 5 Year Budget Projections
 - o Chief Kirko is still working on this and hopes to have further information next month.

CHIEFS REPORT

- Christmas Eve
 - o Chief Kirko requested to close the office at 2:00
- New Year's Eve
 - o Chief Kirko requested to close the office at 2:00
- Fire Truck Discussion
 - O Chief Kirko found three used identical Pierce trucks and sent the photos to the Commissioners. A letter of interest was sent to the dealer. It is a very simple design, 750gal tank, no foam system. The refurb on the trucks would be about 40% of a new purchase price + the truck which is listed for \$300k. After discussion it's been decided to pull the letter of interest.
 - O Chief doesn't want to lean towards used trucks because there are so many components that can go wrong.
 - o Chief Swiger went and took photos of all our trucks and will get the information sent out for estimated worth, HMT, Pucks & Rescue.
 - o NFPA Refurb trucks, everything gets inspected but only replaced if failed inspection.
 - o Chairman Koorn would like to know if the rating bureau is 10 or 15 years on truck replacement. How does it affect the rating?
 - o Commissioner Goen isn't as concerned with the rating but more concerned with what's hidden when buying used vs. new.
- Terry Hill Pierce
 - Terry Hill with Hughes Fire Equipment came and spoke to the Board about truck replacement. He brought drawings of a top and side mount truck. Both trucks are very simple in design and can be customized to fit the departments needs, keeping the trucks exactly the same. These new Pierce trucks are \$454k + tax, this price includes the inspection trip. There are trucks at Skagit 4, Whatcom 1 and Skagit 2 for examples. There

are no holds, and if none available they take approximately 9-10 months to build. There is a financial benefit to buying multiple trucks at once as well as financing available through Oshkosh Truck PNC with the first payment due 1 year after the lease is signed, 3, 5, 7-year leases with 1 payment per year. The interest will depend on the amount borrowed.
